

Case Study: Regional Hospital

The Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre is a state-of-the-art acute care facility located in Thunder Bay, Ontario, serving the needs of people living in Northwestern Ontario. On nearly 70 acres, this hospital has an award winning design that is not only functional but is also efficient. They have 375 acute care beds.

The hospital was built after it became obvious that it would not be feasible to retrofit two older community hospitals, one in the north core and one in the south core. Along with the physical building of this beautiful structure, the hospital also needed to bring together staff groups who would form new teams within this new organizational structure.

We were engaged to work with the senior team for team development and the middle management team for ongoing management training, during lunch and learn sessions. And we worked to train an internal group, hand selected by the CEO, with time dedicated to the internal development of team building and developing great teams within the organization. Over the years we also performed coaching and mentoring, conflict management, and we facilitated numerous workshops and meetings within all areas of the organization, specifically serving the senior team.
